

## GIFFORDTOWN SCHOOLHOUSE MUSEUM

The Giffordtown Schoolhouse Museum dates back to 1884. The original one-room building was later enlarged to two rooms. All students from West Tuckerton and the Little Egg Harbor Township area attended through eighth grade, with four grades in each room. Pot-bellied stoves, fueled by wood and coal, provided heat, and a hand pump in the entryway (the Cloakroom) provided water. The school was in operation until 1951. Formally dedicated on August 7, 1982, the museum contains a large collection of artifacts relating to the Tuckerton (Clamtown) area, including documents from Ebenezer Tucker, Quaker memorabilia, antique furniture, and exhibits of the Tuckerton Railroad and the Tuckerton Wireless Tower. Open Wed. year-round 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM and 1:30 PM - 4:00 PM (12:00 PM to 1:30 PM by appointment) and Sat. June - Labor Day 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM.
